First Specialist Doctor Appointment, to discuss diagnosis and personalized treatment options with a medical fertility specialist: 30 minutes	\$235
Subsequent Review Specialist Doctor Appointments: 30 minutes	\$130 per appointment
Orientation Appointment, comprehensive suite of care to set the plan for treatment, inclusive of appointments with: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Specialist Fertility Doctor • Fertility Nurse • Counsellor • Embryologist 	\$235

Non-IVF Fertility Treatments

Tracked Cycle: A fully monitored natural cycle using blood tests and ultrasound scan/s of the ovaries to detect ovulation and determine hormone profile	\$400 per cycle
Ovulation Induction with Clomiphene to stimulate the ovaries, tracked with blood tests +/- ultrasound scan	\$275 per cycle <i>Average cost of medication \$25</i>
Ovulation Induction with Gonadotrophins, a fully monitored stimulated cycle using blood tests and ultrasound scan/s of the ovaries to detect ovulation and determine hormone profile. Follicle Stimulating Hormone (FSH) injections are used to stimulate the ovaries.	\$750 per cycle <i>Average cost of medication \$1500 - \$2500</i>
Letrozole Cycle: a three month treatment cycle using Letrozole to stimulate ovulation, includes a medical review appointment every three months, blood tests, and email contact with a doctor.	\$475 per three month cycle <i>Average cost of medication \$25</i>

Intrauterine Insemination (IUI), Includes blood tests and ultrasound scan/s of the ovaries if required, to monitor follicular growth and detect ovulation. Two counselling sessions will be required when using donor sperm.

IUI with partner's sperm	\$1200 <i>Average cost of medication \$25 - \$350</i>
IUI with personal donor's sperm	\$1200 <i>Average cost of medication \$25 - \$350</i>
Preparation of personal donor sperm. Includes screening, Prepair screening and first semen freeze. Additional fees for counselling and sperm freezing will be required.	\$1000

Reimbursement to clinic sperm donors \$75 per sample attendance at clinic to a maximum amount of \$750 – reimbursed as petrol vouchers

<u>Donor Egg Addition</u> ; includes cycle coordination and monitoring, final screening prior to commencing cycle (Does not include FER cycle)	\$2100
<u>Donor Egg Work Up</u> ; includes medical consultation, two counselling sessions, screening blood tests and Prepair testing.	\$1785
<u>Donor Egg Reimbursement Charge</u> ; billed to all recipients, reimbursed to egg donors as petrol vouchers	\$1500
<u>Donor Egg Synchronisation Charge</u> ; co-ordination of IVF and FER cycle at same time	\$250
<u>Donor Sperm Addition in IVF</u>	\$300
<u>Surrogacy Work up Charge</u> ; work up of potential surrogate – screening tests and co-ordination with Nurses – separate to ECART application which holds all counselling and medical interviews	\$1000
<u>Surrogacy</u> ; FER co-ordination; calling two sets of patients in cycle	\$250
<u>ECART Application</u> ; Surrogacy and Embryo Donation, includes all preparation and submission of required documentation to ECART, all appointments with a counsellor and consultant. This does not include the costs for legal preparations. This will be discussed during your initial counselling appointment.	\$2500 Application to ECART

District Health Board Fertility Benefit: Fertility Plus offers staff working at any of the northern region DHB's a 10% discount on treatment, excluding medication charges. This is inclusive of ADHB, CMDHB, WDHB, NDHB and also includes St John Ambulance Staff.

Notes about payment:

- Payment is required in full prior to completing treatment on the day of egg collection.
- Subsequent cycles will not be commenced if there is an outstanding balance.
- Prices are in NZ dollars and include GST.
- Prices may be subject to change without further notice.
- The chance of ovulation or pregnancy depends on many factors; there are no refunds if you do not respond to ovulation induction medication (Letrozole or Clomiphene) or if you do not become pregnant.
- Unused medications cannot be refunded once they have been issued to you.
